


Centres of Excellence funding information session

A Centre of Excellence is a scientific consortium which aims to develop the cooperation and joint activities of exceptionally high-level Estonian research groups. The Centre of Excellence focusses on solving high-risk, high-reward research questions based on the needs of Estonia. High-risk, high-reward research leads to a breakthrough research result that significantly affects the current knowledge or practices of one or more fields.

REQUIREMENTS EVALUATION APPLICATION



Duration and amount: 7 million euros for 7 years per Centre of Excellence (01.01.2024–31.12.2030)

Who can apply: positively evaluated state our public research and development institution whose research group(s) participate in the application

The call period: deadline for submitting a statement to begin the application is 30.06.2023 (to Mariann.proos@etag.ee). Application deadline is 15.09.2023. Funding decisions will be announced in December.

The statement should contain:

- the preliminary name of the Centre of Excellence (in Estonian and English)
- a preliminary English summary
- name of the PI along with participating partners
- keywords in English (3–6)

REQUIREMENTS FOR FORMING A CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE




APPLICANT + 1 STATE OR PUBLIC R&D INSTITUTION

+ other non-obligatory partners

3 RESEARCH GROUPS

- + positively evaluated private R&D institutions
- + other research groups or R&D staff from public institutions

NB! Institutions which are not positively evaluated may be included as partners, but their costs cannot be covered from the Centre of Excellence's budget.



RESEARCH GROUPS AND PI-S



The research group must have ongoing funding in 2023. Ongoing projects are projects with an end date on or after the CoE call opening date (22.05.2023) or projects which start in 2023 after May 22, but where the funding decision is made at the latest on 15.09.2023 (deadline for applications). The duration of the project must be at least two years, and the funding must be at least 210,000 euros.

The project must be registered in ETIS. The amount of 210,000 must be grant as a whole, i.e. you cannot combine different funding sources into one larger project.

If the project ends in 2023, the institution must guarantee additional funding for the research group for the year 2024 in the amount of 70,000 euros (guarantee letter must be presented with the application).

The PI of the Centre of Excellence has to be the PI of one of the participating research groups.

The PI of the Centre of Excellence and the PI-s of the research groups included in the application must have a doctorate. They must be at an internationally high level in their field, have experience in conducting research and managing R&D projects, or have corresponding qualifications. **Each PI and research group PI can participate in only one application.** There are no participation restrictions for other research staff.

1. Scientific innovativeness, ambition, and value added (35%)

2. Implementation and cooperation (35%) 3. Impact on the development of the Estonian R&D system, society and economy (30%)

For the final ranking list, ETAG will sum up scores from each criteria which have been multiplied with the relevant coefficients.

Only applications which have received at least 4,0 points (before applying the coefficients) in each individual criterion will be placed in the ranking list.

Up to double the total funding amount worth of applications (98 million euros) is forwarded to the ethics and data management expert panel.

All applications that are forwarded to the ethics and data management expert panel will also be forwarded to the Selection Committee.

PRINCIPLES OF EVALUATION



In evaluating the applications, the selection criteria and sub-criteria must be followed, and the scores must be justified. (See the evaluation guidelines!)


In selection criteria 1, 2, and 3, the evaluation scale is 1 to 5, with a 0,5 step.


Research ethics and data management evaluation scale is "appropriate" – "conditionally appropriate".

The Selection Committee will base their decisions on the following:

- Final scores of the applications
- The Selection Committee will consider that the approved Centres of Excellence should cover the development needs of Estonia's long-term development strategy "Estonia 2035", and, if relevant, the focus areas of the RDIE Strategy as widely as possible
- Presentations made by the PI-s of the Centres of Excellence

The ranking list is **not binding** for the Selection Committee.






RECOMMENDATIONS



Every part of the definition of a Centre of Excellence is important: scientific excellence, cooperation, focussing on the development of Estonia. (Cf. Sub-criterion "To what extent is the relevant and existing scientific competence in Estonia included in the CoE?")

The regulation will be translated into English by 21.06.2023. This will be a certified translation. The evaluation guidelines are also available in English.
